All IAUPR Teacher Education degree programs satisfy the appropriate requirements for teacher certification as established by the Department of Education of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico (DEPR). Teacher Certification Students interested in obtaining the teacher certification to teach in Puerto Rico, must fulfill the current requirements of the Department of Education of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. This applies to students who aspire to be certified by the traditional route, the alternating route or by recertification.

Likewise, students who wish to obtain a teaching certification of another territory, state of the United States of North America or another place of origin, must meet the requirements established in the corresponding jurisdiction.
